

Missing Rivers?

In an article on the Creation, Dinosaurs and the Flood website, (sixdaycreation.com/facts/creation/geology/july98.htm) Charlie Liebert mentions that when he was at the Grand Canyon, the rangers told a story of geologic creation of the canyon, in which rivers from the north (in Utah) fed the canyon to erode it.

He points out that the area of Utah where the rivers come from is 2,000 feet lower in elevation than the north rim of the Canyon, so the water would have to flow uphill.

No problem...except the young earth model, which proposes a great lake as the source of the water that catastrophically eroded the canyon, comes from the same area! Canyonlands Lake (a fictitious lake, for which there is no evidence that it existed) is said to have drained and formed the Grand Canyon...must have been flowing uphill also! (Critique of this lake is in Chapter 5 of my critique of the young earth book, *Grand Canyon: Monument to Catastrophe*.)

There is an unconformity at the top of the Kaibab Limestone in Grand Canyon. Many overlying layers have been eroded away over the last two hundred million years. Of course there is no evidence for these missing rivers, just as there is no evidence for the supposed Canyonlands Lake that created the Grand Canyon.
